Mentor: Phillips considers John "Jack" Quinn of Los Angeles' Arnold & Porter and federal judge Edward Rafeedie as mentors. Phillips started her legal career as a clerk for Rafeedie. "I believe I got my job with Judge Rafeedie because Jack wrote a letter [of recommendation]." Over the



years, Quinn has referred clients to her and been there for her when she needed his counsel. "Everybody adores him. He's been a good friend. It's a very competitive town, and it's nice to have friends."

Mentoring: For firm co-counsel Grace A. Jamra, who became a name partner in August, Phillips let her know that it's OK to be assertive. She encouraged Jamra to develop her own clientele, sit on boards, give speeches and write articles.
